Family skating at the rinks has been a long tradition in our community. To keep the experience enjoyable and for everyone's safety, we ask skaters/hockey players to observe a few rules. For extra security a portable fence has been installed to protect the Kid's Pond from flying pucks, but this doesn't eliminate the risk of injury. It's up to those using the ice to keep it safe.

The AGCL has engaged a security firm again to check for skate tags. The shinny hockey players from other Communities without skate tags will be sent off the ice so that those with tags can use the rink. Names, telephone numbers and the community names where the people without tags came from will be recorded and forwarded to the membership person in their own community. Hopefully, the membership person in these communities

will follow up and make sure a community membership with a skating tag is purchased so that they can skate in any community as intended.

Lot Splitting & Restricted Covenants

Information provided by the Aspen/Westbrook Restricted Covenant Group

Work continues in the Westbrook community with close to 80 per cent of residents agreeing to sign a restricted covenant to shelter their property from re-subdivision or lot splitting, and work is now beginning with Aspen Gardens' residents who may wish to consider taking similar action.

To help the community understand what lot splitting would mean for residents, the Aspen/ Westbrook Restricted Covenant Group has posted a "Did you know" sheet on its web site at: www.edmontonlotsubdivision.com

Now is the time to ensure you have an understanding of what will or will not be allowed, the risks involved, and possible impacts to consider such as density, parking, access to sunlight, traffic, real estate values and property taxes.

As the restricted covenant is the suggested approach by legal advisers and City Council, it is prudent we do all that is possible to remain a well-informed community. If you have questions, would like to assist as a street captain to contact 10 houses in your
